- ... Integrate new ideas and technologies into diabetes education and practice.

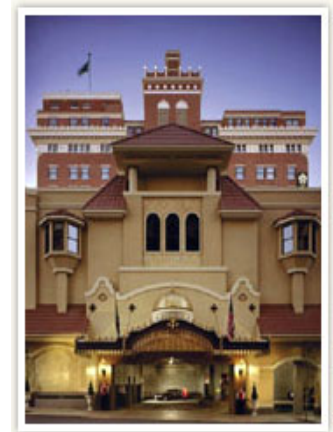
